1 Students must be enrolled full time at the home base school to be eligible for ranking among the top high
2 school seniors.

3
4 All grades earned in grades 10, 11 and the first semester of grade 12 will be counted toward the grade
5 point average and the rank in class.

6
7 Honor roll students will be determined by the following standards approved by the Board:

8
9 *First Honor Roll*

10 Students must have an overall 93 average or above. Students who have a grade LESS than 85 will NOT
11 be eligible.

12
13 *Second Honor Roll*

14 Students must have an overall average of 85 to 92. Students who have a grade LESS than 85 will NOT
15 be eligible.

17 Students who meet these standards, and who do not request otherwise, will have their names submitted
18 to the principal for release to the news media.

19
20 Each school department or club which presents honors or awards or conducts contests will file with the
21 principal the name of the honor, award or contest; the basis for selection of the award and honor; the
22 method of participation; and the reason for the contest.

23
24 The valedictorian and salutatorian must be participants in the Obion County Challenge Program with a
25 minimum of fifteen (15) units. Students must have been enrolled in the Obion County School System four
26 (4) semesters in order to be eligible for these awards.

27
28 The valedictorian and salutatorian selection will be determined at the end of the first semester of the senior
29 year.

31 Senior Top Ten Award recipients must have 22 credits for graduation. These 22 credits must include:

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33 English (honors level, if offered) 4 credits

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35 Math (Algebra I or Math for Technology II
36 Algebra II, and geometry or advanced math) 3 credits

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38 Science 3 credits

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Social Studies (American history, 1/2 credit in economics,
1/2 credit in government, and world history or
world geography) 3 credits

Wellness 1 credit

Computer Training 1 credit

University Path	or	Technical Path	
Foreign Language 2 credits		Vocational Education 4 credits	
Fine Arts 1 credit			

Students in grades nine through eleven will be based on ranked grade averages regardless of the student's educational path. The Top Ten students will be based on cumulative grade averages (accumulated years). Class rankings for grades eleven and below will be determined by the cumulative long semester averages. All Top Ten Awards for seniors will be finalized by the end of the first semester of the current school year.
