AREAS OF NON-COMPLIANCE	PLAN FOR COMPLIANCE

The General Assembly has authorized the State Board of Education to prescribe curricula and to make rules and regulations for approval and governance of all public schools, grades K through 12, or any combination of these grades (Section 49-1-101, through 49-6-201 of Tennessee Code Annotated). However, certain laws have been enacted and are still in effect, which are applicable to schools and school personnel. As part of the compliance report of the school system, the status of the LEA with respect to the legal duties and responsibilities should be carefully checked. There are no provisions in the laws whereby waivers may be granted or exceptions made for non-compliance.

Information concerning public school law is contained in the following publication: Tennessee Code Annotated (Vol. 9) - The Miche Company, Charlottesville, VA.

A school system/school may be approved with waivers granted by the Commissioner. Failure to correct the deficiency will be a factor in the approval of the school system/school the following school year.

All regionally accredited schools (not just SACS) are recognized Category III nonpublic schools (effective June 2008).
