- 1 The Board shall provide for a system-wide testing program which shall be periodically reviewed and evaluated.
- 2 The purposes of the program shall be to:

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- 1. Assist in promoting accountability;
 - 2. Determine the progress of students;
 - 3. Assess the effectiveness of the instructional program and student learning;
 - 4. Aid in counseling and guiding students in planning future education and other endeavors;
 - 5. Analyze the improvements needed in a given instructional area;
- 6. Assist in the screening of students with learning difficulties;^{1,2}
 - 7. Assist in placing students in remedial programs;
 - 8. Provide information for college entrance and placement; and
- 19 9. Assist in educational research by providing data.
- 20 The director of schools shall be responsible for planning and implementing the program, which includes:
- 21 1. Determining specific purposes for each test;
- 22232. Selecting the appropriate test to be given;
 - 3. Establishing procedures for administering the tests;
- 4. Making provision for interpreting and disseminating the results;
- 5. Maintaining testing information in a consistent and confidential manner; and
- 6. Ensuring that results are obtained as quickly as possible, especially when placement in a special learning program might be necessary.
- State-mandated student testing programs shall be undertaken in accordance with procedures published by the State Department of Education.³
- 35 WEIGHTING OF TCAP AND EOC SCORES
- 36 Student scores on the Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program's grades three through eight (3-8) shall
- 37 comprise fifteen (15%) percent of the student's final grade in the spring semester in the subject areas of
- 38 mathematics, reading/language arts, science and social studies. ⁴ The director of schools may exclude Tennessee

Testing Programs 4,700

1 Comprehensive Assessment Program scores from students' final grades if the scores are not received by the district at least five (5) instructional days before the end of the school year.⁵

- 3 High School End of Course Exam scores will be included in students' final grades as follows:⁶
- a.) 2016-2017 school year 10% of the student's second semester average of a yearlong course or 10% of the last nine weeks' average in a semester long block class.
 - b.) 2017-2018 school year 15% of the student's second semester average of a yearlong course or 15% of the last nine weeks' average in a semester long block class.
 - c.) 2018-2019 school year 15% of the student's second semester average of a yearlong course or 15% of the last nine weeks' average in a semester long block class.
- 10 Other tests may be given as requested by students, teachers, or parents when approved by the principal.
- 11 The director of schools may exclude end-of-course (EOC) scores from students' final grades if scores are not
- 12 received by the district at least five (5) instructional days before the end of the course.⁵

13 TESTING INFORMATION AND PARENTAL CONSENT

- 14 Any test directly concerned with measuring student ability or achievement through individual or group
- 15 psychological or socio-metric tests shall not be administered by or with the knowledge of any employee of the
- 16 system without first obtaining written consent of the parents or guardians.²
- 17 Results of all group tests shall be recorded on the students' permanent records and shall be made available to
- appropriate personnel in accordance with established procedures.⁷
- 19 No later than July 31 of each year, the Board shall publish on its website information related to state and board
- 20 mandated tests that will be administered during the school year. The information shall include:8
- 21 1. The name of the test;

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- 23 2. The purpose and use of the test;
- 25 3. The grade or class in which the test will be administered;
- 27 4. The tentative date or dates that the test will be administered;
- 5. The time and manner in which parents and students will be notified of the results of the test; and
- 6. How parents can access the questions and answers on their student's state-required tests.
- 32 Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year and for school years thereafter, the testing information shall also be
- 33 placed in student handbooks or other school publications that are provided to parents on an annual basis.
