- 1 Students must be enrolled full time at the home base school to be eligible for ranking among the top high
- 2 school seniors.
- 3 All grades earned in grades 9, 10, 11 and 12 will be counted toward the grade point average and the rank
- 4 in class.
- 5 Honor roll students will be determined by the following standards:
- 6 First Honor Roll
- Students must have an overall 93 average or above. Students who have a grade less than 85 will not be eligible.
- 9 Second Honor Roll
- Students must have an overall average of 85 to 92. Students who have a grade less than 85 will not be
- 11 eligible.

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- 12 Students who meet these standards, and who do not request otherwise, will have their names submitted
- to the principal for release to the news media.
- Each school department or club which presents honors or awards or conducts contests will file with the
- principal the name of the honor, award, or contest; the basis for selection of the award and honor; the
- method of participation; and the reason for the contest.
- 17 The valedictorian and salutatorian must be participants in the Obion County Challenge Program.
- 18 Students must have been enrolled in the Obion County School System for four (4) successive
- semesters immediately prior to graduation in order to be eligible for these awards.
- The valedictorian and salutatorian selection will be determined at the end of the end of the senior year.
- 21 To be a graduate of the Obion County Challenge Program, the student must have completed, as part of
- 22 his/her graduation requirements:
  - 4 credits in English (honors level, if offered)
    - 4 credits in math (Algebra I, Algebra II, geometry, and an advanced math)
- 4 credits in science (Biology I, Chemistry I, Biology II, Chemistry II, physics, or anatomy and physiology)
  - 2 Career and Technical Education courses or 2 Dual Enrollment courses
    - Minimum requirement of the Tennessee Diploma Project

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- Student must earn a minimum of 85 final average in every course
- Student must maintain a 95 percent attendance rate

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- Student must have an acceptable discipline record with no out-of-school suspensions
- 4 The Top Ten students will be based on cumulative grade averages (accumulated years). Class rankings
- 5 for all students will be determined by the cumulative long semester averages.
